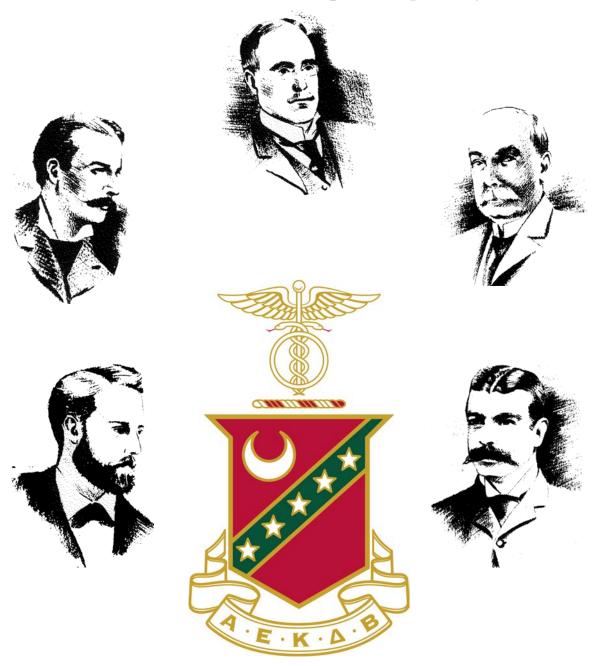

ALUMNI CHAPTER MANUAL

Introduction

As an alumnus of Kappa Sigma Fraternity, you and your family are valued members of the Kappa Sigma Community. As with good government, good churches, and good schools, perpetuation can come only from continued support of those who believe in the worth of the organization. A willingness to continue giving something of yourself – your time, your thought, your effort, your energy – can be the greatest source of satisfaction for an active alumnus of Kappa Sigma.

Did your Fraternity interest end on graduation day . . . or is it just beginning? Thousands of Brothers like yourself have found that participation in one of Kappa Sigma's chartered Alumni Chapters provides them with the opportunity to remain active in our Fraternity and enjoy the fellowship of many Brothers and their families.

This manual has been designed to assist active and involved alumni in establishing a viable Alumni Chapter. It will also guide ongoing alumni chapters in planning activities and programming. Our Fraternity is no stronger than our interest in it or our willingness to support it. The participation by and involvement of our Brothers in Alumni Chapters helps to insure that Kappa Sigma's tradition of excellence will continue as strongly in the future as it has in the past.

What Is An Alumni Chapter?

An Alumni Chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity is a formal organization of all Kappa Sigma alumni residing within a given geographical area, regardless of their chapter of initiation. It is chartered by the Fraternity as an official Alumni Chapter.

Alumni Clubs and Associations

In contrast to chartered Alumni Chapters, special mention needs to be made concerning Alumni Clubs or Associations. Alumni of a particular chapter, informally gathered primarily as a social group, and not as a corporation for housing, are not an Alumni Chapter but an Alumni Club or Association of that chapter. Alumni Clubs or Associations are not chartered by the Fraternity and are not recognized at Grand Conclaves. However, Alumni Clubs or Associations may petition the SEC for Alumni Chapter status at any time providing membership is open to any initiated Brother of the Fraternity.

Why Organize or Join an Alumni Chapter?

An organized Alumni Chapter allows members to enjoy continued association with Kappa Sigma. Sharing fellowship with new and old friends is the foundation of life as a Kappa Sigma. These groups offer opportunities for social activities, as well meaningful contributions to the Fraternity. An Alumni Chapter offers a sense of purpose and provides more continuity than just a social gathering. Here are eight outstanding purposes any Alumni Chapter can have for its existence:

- 1. To enjoy Kappa Sigma fellowship with Brothers from many chapters.
- 2. More efficient networking capabilities for Alumni/Undergraduates.
- 3. To increase community involvement through community service projects.
- 4. To assist undergraduate chapters in an advisory capacity on various matters affecting chapter operations.
- 5. To assist in the formation of new undergraduate chapters.
- 6. To assist the overall programs of the Fraternity, such as supporting the General Fraternity and Endowment Fund.
- 7. To increase favorable community understanding of the fraternity system and especially of Kappa Sigma.
- 8. To assist newly-graduated Brothers and alumni transferring into the area to obtain suitable employment.

Alumni Chapters are an integral part of the Fraternity providing alumni a constructive outlet for their talents and an opportunity to remain "active" Brothers for many years after graduation.

Basic Guidelines for Establishing an Alumni Chapter

While methods of organizing an Alumni Chapter differ from one area to another and from large geographical areas to small, the following guidelines present a basic approach for establishing a successful organization. It is important to note that only ten Brothers are needed to organize an Alumni Chapter. Do not be disappointed if early efforts in membership recruitment results in less-than-anticipated turnout. It is more important to organize the Alumni Chapter with a small number of involved and motivated Brothers than to risk losing enthusiasm in waiting for a larger initial membership group. The steps involved with organizing an Alumni Chapter are as follows:

- 1. Approach the District Grand Master, Alumnus Advisor, local dignitaries (to get them involved) and the Headquarters in the initial stage of the formation of the Alumni Chapter.
- 2. Request a geographical printout from Headquarters of all Kappa Sigma's residing in your area. Since the membership list is in zip code order on the computer, it will help expedite matters if you specify a central zip code located within your geographical area rather than city names.
- 3. Identify several key alumni who might assist in the initial organization efforts. This can be accomplished by either sending a letter of intent stating your interest in forming an Alumni Chapter or, if the area is small in size, by calling several alumni. If a letter is used, be sure to include a return card asking for (1) address; (2) phone number; (3) interest in becoming a charter member; and (4) interest in assisting in the organizational stage.
- 4. Schedule a meeting of your organizational committee to begin planning the organizational meeting.
- 5. Set a definite meeting date, including time and place, well in advance. Consider contacting the local undergraduate chapter to add enthusiasm to your efforts and to consider using their facilities.
 - Choose a location that is common and a date that is consistent.
- 6. Prepare the initial meeting agenda allowing adequate time for prospective members to acquaint themselves with each other. Possible items to discuss include: purpose of forming an Alumni Chapter, organization and officers, activities, committees, dues, meeting dates, relations with undergraduates, building enthusiasm, recruitment, etc.

- 7. Plan the method of initial contact with prospective members informing them of the organizational meeting (a letter followed by a personal visit or telephone call). A sample organizational letter is included in Appendix B of this manual.
 - Hold a small meet and greet
- 8. Contact alumni to get a definite commitment for participation, and ask if they know of other local Kappa Sigma's who would be interested.
- 9. Solicit the ideas of those attending the organizational meeting for development of future programs and activities (see #7 above). For future reference you may want to use a questionnaire asking about hobbies, general interests and expectations.
- 10. When officers have been elected, you are ready to petition for a charter.

How to Petition the SEC for the Alumni Chapter Charter?

- 1. The Constitution of Kappa Sigma (Article VI. Section 1) provides for the establishment of alumni chapters. The SEC requests a list of 10 or more alumni residing near each other be listed with the petition. A petition should be sent to the Director of Education Programs at Headquarters listing the names, chapters, and years of initiation of the Brothers petitioning. A typewritten list of names to be included on the petition should be attached to the petition to facilitate record keeping.
- 2. The petition should be accompanied by a \$400 check, which covers the costs of preparing the formal charter, setting up necessary accounts and the first year's dues for the Alumni Chapter (June 1-May 31). Thereafter, dues of \$300 per year per Alumni Chapter (not per member) are payable to Headquarters.
- 3. Also required for the petition is a copy of the alumni chapter's by-laws. A sample set is listed in the appendix for your review. If you would like a Word version for editing please contact the Director of Education Programs.
- 4. Lastly, a complete one page application sheet (see appendix) should be included with the petition. This sheet will provide the names and contact information for the Executive Committee of the Alumni Chapter.

NOTES ON: By-Laws and Internal Organization

A suggested set of By-Laws, subject to local revisions, is shown in Appendix D. Once your Alumni Chapter has completed its set of By-Laws, distribute copies to the members for their personal reference and use. The following paragraphs offer explanatory notes on By-Law preparation and suggestions you should consider when forming the internal organization of the Alumni Chapter. (Alumni Chapter differs greatly in regard to organization based on the desires of the full membership. The following information is presented solely to assist your efforts toward consolidating the internal organization of the Alumni Chapter.)

Naming the Alumni Chapter

Most Alumni Chapters are named after the city of location or geographical area. This makes it easier for an alumnus moving to the area to determine if an Alumni Chapter exists locally or not. Naming the Alumni Chapter after the local undergraduate chapter (i.e., Sigma Upsilon Alumni Chapter) may give the false impression that the membership is composed of only Brothers from that particular chapter.

Dues

The matter of dues payable by members is left to the discretion of each Alumni Chapter. However, most Alumni Chapters collect dues to cover the inevitable expenses of postage, printing, secretarial charges and social events. Amounts usually range from \$10 to \$25 a year. A few Alumni Chapters have set annual dues to include the price of a monthly dinner, thus assuring a good turnout of those whose dues have been paid at each meeting.

Notices of meeting should be sent to *all* alumni on roll, whether dues-paying or not. This technique may eventually attract some of the non-payers, and it will also maintain their Kappa Sigma contact. The Alumni Chapter may decide, however, to allow only dues-paying members to be eligible for the purpose of voting on any given question.

Officers

The By-Laws of Kappa Sigma (Article VII, Section 2) states the officers of an Alumni Chapter shall be designated as Grand Master, Grand Scribe and Grand Treasurer, along with such officers as the chapter may require. Most Alumni Chapters also elect a Grand Procurator and a Grand Master of Ceremonies in order to obtain more participation and to increase alumni interest. The offices of GS and GT may be held by the same person. However, the GS usually has the most time-consuming job in any Alumni Chapter. He is responsible for mailing notices, keeping address lists up-to-date and making arrangements for meetings.

Term of Office

As stated in the By-Laws of Kappa Sigma (Article VII, Section 2), the officers of an Alumni Chapter shall be elected annually. The Alumni Chapter should notify Headquarters after annual elections are held in order to advise the Fraternity of the current officers and how they can be reached if necessary. Remember to include the person to be listed as the main contact person for the chapter.

Meetings

Local conditions and the desires of the membership will determine the frequency and location of meetings. Regular meeting dates, such as the first Tuesday of each month, etc., are best, since announcement notices will be unnecessary if such a meeting pattern is established. A telephone call list can be very effective and yet not work a hardship on anyone, if set up on a pyramid basis (i.e., one man starts it by calling five members, each of whom calls another five, and so on). A real attempt should be made to have at least one meeting each quarter.

Place of Meeting

For regular weekly or monthly meetings a well-located, reasonably-priced restaurant with a private dining room is preferred by many Alumni Chapters. Remember, many younger alumni are the chapter's best prospects for active leadership, and a restaurant which is too expensive will prevent their participation. In larger cities, a downtown location is often the best solution for regular meetings. However, occasional rotation from one part of the city to another may attract a better-rounded support by all alumni. A large turnout, while desirable, is not essential for a good meeting. If the Alumni Chapter is functioning effectively with a small group who is having a good time together and accomplishing something for the Fraternity, others will hear about it and become interested.

Publicize your Meetings and Activities

The *Caduceus* welcomes any information submitted by Alumni Chapters concerning their activities, meetings, and functions. Alumni Chapters use the *Caduceus* and Fraternity social media accounts to publicize upcoming events sponsored by the chapter. Photographs of your events are also welcome. It is highly recommended that articles be regularly submitted by Alumni Chapters to inform other alumni and Alumni Chapters of current interests and activities.

You may also request that the date and location of the meeting be placed on the Kappa Sigma website for further publicity. Send all *Caduceus* submissions and suggested social media posts to pr@hq.kappasigma.org.

Alumni Chapter Activities and **Programming**

The strength of an Alumni Chapter depends to a great extent on the involvement and participation of the members at Alumni Chapter activities and functions. Promoting continued Brotherhood through social activities should be a prime goal of your Alumni Chapter. Sponsoring social activities and functions can stimulate and encourage participation and enthusiasm. Since membership includes both the young and the not-so-young, social events should be varied to appeal to everyone. While one of your main purposes for organizing the Alumni Chapter may be assistance to the Fraternity or to the local undergraduate chapter, varied social activities and functions will insure the continued enthusiasm of the Alumni Chapters and its ideals. The following paragraphs provide ideas for projects and activities you may want to include in your Alumni Chapter's annual calendar of events. These suggestions are divided into two groups: activities to be planned for the membership of the Alumni Chapter and functions to support the Fraternity.

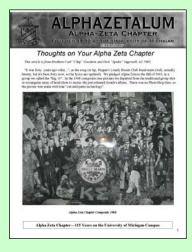
Within Your Alumni Chapter

Membership Directory

One of the useful tools in getting an Alumni Chapter started (and in keeping it going) is an address directory of all alumni living in the area. In addition to basic address information, some Alumni Chapters include the following information: occupation, business address and phone, spouse's name, sorority affiliation, and children's name and birthdays.

To organize a directory, first obtain a list of alumni residing in the area from Headquarters. Since the HQ files are maintained to meet post office requirements, please specify particular zip codes rather than city names.

Newsletters



An Alumni Chapter newsletter informs all Kappa Sigma's in the area of the upcoming events of the chapter. It is an excellent method of keeping individual members current.

Luncheons

Regularly scheduled alumni luncheons allow Brothers to meet at a convenient time and place to enjoy each other's fellowship. This provides a welcome break in daily routine and is a good way to keep tabs on activities. It is also an excellent method for alumni new to the community to contact members of the Alumni Chapter.

Alumni Chapter Activities

Nominations for Kappa Sigma Man of the Year

Since 1937, the Fraternity has honored a distinguished alumnus each year by naming him Man of the Year. A committee makes this selection based upon nominations received from Alumni Chapters. Your Alumni Chapter should make an effort to canvass its membership prior to July 1st, the annual deadline for nominations, and to present a nominee for this annual award. Active chapters in the vicinity of the award dinner participate, and much favorable publicity is given to Kappa Sigma through this event.

Recreational Activities

Developing recreational teams in various sports is an outstanding method to meet the desires of the chapter membership but also engage their families and the community. Creating teams for softballs, bowling, golf, etc., provides the chapter an opportunity to build strong community relations.

Assistance to Undergraduate Chapters

This is a most important reason for the formation and operation of an Alumni Chapter of Kappa Sigma. Undergraduate chapters of the Fraternity always need alumni assistance and support. Seldom does an undergraduate chapter get into serious trouble – moral, scholastic or financial – if there has been alumni interest and guidance available. It is important that all our undergraduate chapters have the interest and support of Kappa Sigma alumni. Here are a number of areas of support which an Alumni Chapter can provide a nearby undergraduate chapter.

Dinners and Outings

Hosting dinners and outings are successful ways to bring all members of your alumni chapter together. Examples of successful and low-cost dining activities include potluck dinners and picnics. Outings for members can also create memories for the whole family. Beach trips, fishing, and site seeing trips all provide opportunities for fellowship.

Young Alumni

Young alumni networking socials or simply social events are a great way to get recent graduates involved in your chapter and the Association at large. Networking socials often include representatives from local businesses or career development speakers.

Alumnus Advisors and Assistant Alumnus Advisors

It is important that dedicated alumni volunteer for these jobs which are so vital to the proper functioning of an undergraduate chapter. An Alumni Chapter can supply the support these volunteers need in order to work effectively with the undergraduate chapter. From the ranks of Kappa Sigma's Alumni Chapters come the future leadership – the local, district, and international – of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity. Therefore, one of the most significant areas of support an Alumni Chapter can provide is to furnish good men for these positions. Contact the District Grand Master for current volunteer needs.

Champion Ouest Assistance

The rushing efforts of an undergraduate chapter are its most important activity. A number of Alumni Chapters sponsor rush parties annually to assist the local undergraduate chapter or to benefit all chapters in the state. These functions can take the form of barbecues, boat and water parties, sporting events, etc., but the objective is the same: to introduce rushees to Kappa Sigma under the most favorable circumstances.

Dinner Dances

Dinner dances, held at a nearby undergraduate chapter house or at private clubs, can be for alumni only or combined to include the undergraduates. Many Alumni Chapters hold dinner dances in conjunction with Founders' Day activities.

Homecoming and other Campus Events

Campus events are great opportunities to gather the membership at a chapter house or to the event itself. Lectures, plays, concerts, and recitals can all serve as enjoyable gettogethers for the membership of the Alumni Chapter.

Informal Gatherings

Informal gatherings can be based on any number of ideas: sports events, television shows, card games, picnics with families and friends, holidays, local civic activities, etc. Use your imagination.

Alumni-Undergraduate Contests

Football, basketball, softball, etc. are always highlights for involving undergraduate Brothers in your activities. Alumni-undergraduate outings such as barbecues, canoe trips, fishing trips, etc. can bring Brothers together for a good time.

Initiations

All members of the Alumni Chapter are encouraged to attend initiations. Your presence emphasizes the true meaning of Kappa Sigma and will probably rekindle your own feelings toward the Fraternity. Several Alumni Chapters have developed skilled initiation teams which have performed initiations for undergraduate chapters.

Founders' Day, December 10th

This annual celebration provides an opportunity for alumni and undergraduates to gather for a festive occasion. Guest speakers, such as SEC members, DGMs, outstanding alumni, and Fraternity staff are willing to assist. Founders' Day celebrations can also be an ideal time to present Scholarship/Leadership Awards and to recognize Brothers who have been members of Kappa Sigma for fifty years or longer.

Other Celebrations

Stephen Alonzo Jackson Day (March 4th), 50th, 75th, and 100th anniversaries are also excellent times to gather and share fellowship and achievements within the Fraternity. With the involvement and support of Alumni Chapters, these events can be significant events of the year.

Colonization of New Chapters

Rarely is it possible to organize a new undergraduate chapter of Kappa Sigma without organized alumni support. An Alumni Chapter can perform an exceedingly vital job for the Fraternity in this area. Alumni Chapters should always be alert for possibilities to form Kappa Sigma colonies in schools without existing chapters.



Vocational Assistance

Some Alumni Chapters provide informal placement services for undergraduates for both permanent and summer employment. Local alumni can be surveyed with regard to possible openings in their business concerns and interviews can be arranged for interested undergraduates. At several undergraduate chapters, the Alumni Chapter members conduct vocational information seminars.



Scholarship Awards

Awards to recognize the individual scholastic achievement of an undergraduate can be based on many things (general improvement in scholarship, highest GPA, etc.). Competition with nearby undergraduate chapters can also be generated.

A Greater Cause

Some Alumni Chapters have found an excellent way to increase community understanding of the fraternity system (and particularly Kappa Sigma) is to perform community service projects during the year. Publicity for this type of worthwhile project is often easy to generate. A survey of the membership would probably provide a list of worthwhile organizations which need help and assistance. Do not forget that nearby colleges or universities would be greatly flattered by an offer of assistance from your Alumni Chapter.

Additional Support for the Fraternity

Alumni Chapters also support Kappa Sigma by promoting and assisting the efforts of the Endowment Fund, District Conclaves, Chapter Retreats, International Golf Month, and other Fraternity special events and projects. Your Alumni Chapter can make a major contribution to Kappa Sigma by actively promoting the philosophy of an International Fraternity among alumni and undergraduate Brothers. The strength and continued support of our Fraternity depends on the loyalty of our Brothers.

What the Fraternity Can Do For Your Alumni Chapter?

Computerized Address Listings and Address Labels

New Alumni Chapters can get a list of alumni in the area by zip code order or chapter of initiation by writing or emailing Headquarters. Address labels can be used for mailing announcements, newsletters, invitations or other communications with members.

Grand Conclaves

An Alumni Chapter can be represented at the Biennial Grand Conclave by a delegate who has two votes. This provides an excellent opportunity to exchange ideas with other Alumni Chapters and to play an active role in determining the future of our Fraternity.

You, as a Kappa Sigma, automatically receive a lifetime subscription to the quarterly magazine of the Fraternity, *The Caduceus*. All Kappa Sigma's are encouraged to send in articles for publication.

Appendix D Sample Alumni Chapter By-Laws

By-Laws of the Greater Phoenix Alumni Chapter of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity

Article I - Name and Objectives

Section 1. Name: This organization shall be known as the Greater Phoenix Alumni Chapter of Kappa Sigma Fraternity (the "Alumni Chapter").

Section 2. Objectives: The objectives of the Alumni Chapter are to encourage Kappa Sigma fellowship among both undergraduates and graduates, to support and encourage Arizona undergraduate and Alumni Chapters of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity, and to advance the general welfare of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity.

Article II – Membership and Administration

Section 1. Membership: Any alumnus member of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity who is in good standing shall be eligible for membership in the Alumni Chapter. Membership shall be established upon the payment of dues.

Section 2. Dues: Dues of \$25.00 per year shall be payable to the Grand Treasurer of the Alumni Chapter by all members. Dues are due on February 1 of each year or upon becoming a member, whichever is later.

Section 3. Administration:

- (a) Officers of the Alumni Chapter shall be the Grand Master, Grand Procurator, Grand Master of Ceremonies, Grand Scribe and Grand Treasurer and shall comprise the Executive Committee. Terms of office shall be one full year following election. All officers are eligible for re-election.
- (b) Officer elections shall be held at a regularly scheduled membership meeting in March or April of each year. Nominations may be made at any time up until the time of the election. Each member of the Alumni Chapter in good standing is eligible for election and entitled to vote. Votes may be cast by a valid proxy. Officers shall be elected by a simple majority.
- (c) Vacancies on the Executive Committee, from any cause other than expiration of the term of office, shall be filed by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Committee, and the officer so elected shall hold office for the remainder of the unexpired term of the member of the Committee whom he succeeds.
- (d) Duties of Officers:

- 1) The Grand Master shall exercise such functions and duties as would normally be those of the presiding officer under parliamentary law. He shall preside at all meetings of the Alumni Chapter or its Executive Committee.
- 2) The Grand Procurator shall assist the Grand Master in the performance of his duties and, in case of his absence or disability, succeed to his powers and duties until relieved from such duties by action of the Alumni Chapter or the Executive Committee.
- 3) The Grand Master of Ceremonies shall be responsible for any ritualistic work in which the Alumni Chapter may engage, such as organizing and training an initiation team, etc. He is second in line of succession as chief executive officer in the event of absence or disability of both the Grand Master and Grand Procurator.
- 4) The Grand Scribe shall keep a roster of the names and addresses of Alumni Chapter members. He shall prepare and distribute all written announcements of the Alumni Chapter. He shall keep minutes of the official meetings of the Executive Committee and of the Alumni Chapter. He shall prepare a quarterly newsletter for the benefit of the members.
- 5) The Grand Treasurer shall act as custodian of funds of the Alumni Chapter, depositing such funds in trust, in a reliable bank, for the accurate and detailed record of all transactions. The Grand Treasurer shall make disbursements of more than \$250.00 only on orders of the Executive Committee, for purposes approved by a simple majority of the Executive Committee.
- (e) All Alumni Chapter business and related proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the Constitution, By-Laws and Rules of the Kappa Sigma Fraternity.

Article III – Meetings

Section 1. Regular Meetings: The Alumni Chapter shall hold monthly meetings at a date, time and location in the Greater Phoenix Area established by the Executive Committee.

Section 2. Quorum: A quorum shall consist of four or more Alumni Chapter members, at least two of whom shall be officers of the Alumni Chapter. The lack of a quorum shall not prevent the Alumni Chapter officers from handling administrative affairs of the Alumni Chapter.

Article IV – Adoption and Amendment

A 2/3 vote of a quorum of the Alumni Chapter, indicated by the signature of the Grand Scribe below, shall be required for the adoption of these By-Laws, and any future amendments, which shall become effective immediately.
